The heiress is very well connected and has many friends, particularly among the social elite. She has invited a number of these friends for a private cruise. Many of the guests are your friends or acquaintances, while some may be new to you. Excitement abounds, and all are eagerly awaiting the main event of the evening: a high stakes poker tournament with a \$20,000 buy in! It's sure to be an experience that no one will ever forget. Come visit with old friends and make new ones in an incredible night of entertainment, poker, and... murder!

How to play

You are a character in a murder mystery game. Below you will see a detailed description of your character, followed by a brief description of the other characters in the game. Read through this information before the party so you will have a basic idea of your character and that of the other players. Before the event, do not discuss any of your character's information or secrets with others who will be playing the game. Dressing up is encouraged. The general dress is 60s style casual or semi-formal, though your individual character may give you particular ideas about how to dress. Upon arrival at the event, the host will give you a sheet that you will use during Act 1. He or she will also provide additional instruction at certain points and will be able to answer questions about the game. The sheet the host provides will contain one or more announcements that your character will make during Act 1 as well as indications of how to respond to other characters. While parts of the game follow an exact script, others do not, and you will have the freedom to interpret your character however you choose. Everyone has secrets and knowledge as well as objectives of their own, so the more you talk to the other guests, the more you will learn, and the more fun you will have.

Your Background

Your name is Patricia Penn. You are a stunning Hollywood star at the apex of your career. Recent hits, such as *Another Night in the Bronx* and *I Love the Lights of L.A.*, have propelled you to stardom in ways you never could have imagined just a few short years ago when you were a struggling actress.

William West, a renowned movie producer, gave you your first big break. He saw you on the set of one of his films, in which you had a single line as an office secretary. He instantly took a liking to your acting ability and asked you to audition for the lead role in *Another Night in the Bronx*. You couldn't believe it when he told you that you got the part! During the filming, William invited you and several other key members of the cast to join him on frequent trips to the Swan, the New Orleans based riverboat casino of his old friend, Mary Milton. Mary was always there when you went, and you found her to be an enchanting person. She is the heiress of the Milton family fortune.

It wasn't until the premier of the movie that William professed his feelings toward you. You were shocked! William was nearly twice your age, and you'd never looked at him as anything other than a boss and friend, so you told him you didn't feel the same way. The Guest List

The Heiress – Mary Milton. Owner of the Swan riverboat casino. An affable and charismatic woman who loves to make friends, particularly with the social elite.

The Writer – Donna Davidson. Exploded onto the romance novel scene with her steamy debut novel, *Wild Hearts and Bodices*. Has amassed fame and fortune over the last few years, though her newest release was a major flop.

The Comedian – Robert Rich. Spent a decade trying to make it big as a comedian in the Big Apple before giving up and moving his act to the Big Easy. Spends a significant amount of time on the Swan and appears to have a major gambling problem.

The Producer – William West. Famous Hollywood movie producer. Discovered Patricia Penn and gave her the starring role in one of his most recent blockbusters, *Another Night in the Bronx*.

The Actress – Patricia Penn. Struggled to make her mark in Hollywood before landing the lead role in *Another Night in the Bronx*. Won even more fame for her performance in *I Love the Lights of L.A.* An exceptional poker player. Girlfriend of the Tennis Pro.

The Doctor – James Johnson. Has a successful practice in Baton Rouge that allows him free time and an affluent lifestyle. Frequent visitor at the Swan.

The Tennis Pro – Lazare Lebeau. From the French Quarter of New Orleans. Has a hint of a Cajun French accent and is the 247th ranked tennis player in the world, two factors that have always played well with the ladies. Boyfriend of the Actress.
